



Harold was born on March 18, 1923, the son of Forrest L. and Alice R. (Powell) Jacobs in Browning, Missouri. He was raised in Kirksville, Missouri, until 1937.

In 1937, he enlisted into the United States Navy. He proudly served his country, serving aboard the USS Tennessee. Harold was a survivor of the Pearl Harbor attack. He was honorably discharged in 1945.

On January 3, 1943, he was united in marriage to Lorraine Trihub. They made their home in East Moline, IL until 1947, when they moved to Max, and in 1955 moving to Minot. Harold was self-employed with Harold's Trim Shop, an upholstery business, later working for Fisher Motors and Westlie Motors, all in Minot. Lorraine died January 19, 2006. He assisted with many of the residents, at Trinity Homes, many of whom he considered family.

Harold enjoyed flying and restoring airplanes. You could also find him riding his Harley-Davidson motorcycle. He purchased his first one while in the Navy, and enjoyed them his entire life. While working on the Garrison Diversion project, he would ride his Harley to work year round.
