

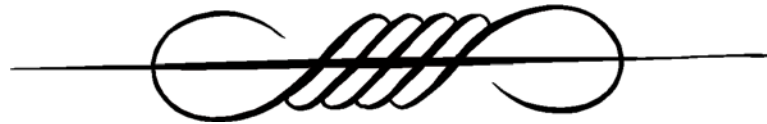
**Jimmy Sloan**—57, Minot, died Wednesday, January 20, 2010 at Trinity Health.
